As President of the newly named Portfolio Management Association of Canada (PMAC), Katie Walmsley is responsible for directing the Association's overall business strategy, including federal and provincial advocacy, education, compliance support and other member services.

PMAC was founded in 1952 and until 2010, operated as the Investment Counsel Association of Canada (ICAC). PMAC represents 140 of Canada's registered portfolio managers managing in excess of \$750 billion in assets. Members span private clients, pensions, insurance, foundations and endowments individual and institutional investors.

Before joining the Association in 2006, Ms. Walmsley held several senior leadership positions in both the insurance industry and the association/not-for-profit sector. She served 10 years with Pilot Insurance Company (a subsidiary of Aviva Canada) in a variety of management positions, including Sr. Vice President, Corporate Development with responsibility for Strategic Planning, Human Resources, Communications and e-Business and Sr. Vice President of Human Resources. Her non-profit/association management experience includes two years with the Insurance Institute of Canada as Sr. Director of Western and Atlantic Operations with responsibility for coordinating education and training delivery in eight provinces with local institutes and boards of directors. Ms. Walmsley also spent five years with the Hincks Dellcrest Treatment Centre as Human Resources Director.

During her volunteer time, she is President and Co-Founder of Second Kicks, a registered charity that collects and distributes used soccer uniforms and equipment to economically disadvantaged communities in Canada and around the world. She is past Director of the Canadian Capital Markets Association, past Director of Ryerson University's Financial Institutions Advisory Council (FIAC) and Past President of Camp Couchiching.
